## **Rationale for Hiring Minimally Qualified Faculty**

In certain instances minimally qualified, rather than professionally or doctorally qualified, faculty are hired to teach business-related courses. This is neither an oversight on the part of the School of Business and Management nor a convenience to the administration. Selecting faculty who are highly qualified business and industry experts--men and women who have put their energies into becoming experts in their fields--to teach practice-related courses is in keeping with mission of the university to offer our students a hands-on, relevant, practical education.

Please note that although a few minimally part-time faculty are hired, the greater concern of the School of Business is to maintain the highest standards of academic pedagogy including hiring instructors who are doctorally or professionally qualified. In no instance is a minimally qualified part-time instructor hired to teach a course in which theoretical, research-related, advanced problem solving or synthesis of advanced material is covered. In those courses, doctorally qualified and professionally qualified faculty are hired because of their formal training in how to teach these advanced levels of learning.

**Accounting.** Frank Murphy, CPA, teaches AC 410 Auditing. Mr. Murphy is a retired audit partner of Coopers & Lybrand L.L.P., who continues to consult with his former company. He also consults with the California State Board of Accountancy in investigations of failed audits. In addition to sharing his expert knowledge about auditing with students, he serves as a role model for those who want to join a prestigious international accounting firm.

Rodney Sekerak, CPA, was hired to teach AC304-305 in the weekend program. He brings to the classroom a wealth of practical, professional experience and excellent teaching credentials. His experience includes high-level accounting position with Cooper and Lybrand, the Bellflower (California) Unified School District, KRI Communications, and the U.S. Air Force. His varied experience is an asset to a program that offers a practical, professional education to working adult students.

Computer Information Systems: The opportunity to secure faculty such as Pat Reed, Director of Information Systems at Disney, to teach Computer Information Systems courses allows students to benefit from cutting-edge industry technology which otherwise

would be unavailable. CIS particularly benefits from hiring part-time instructors to teach programming courses from leading local businesses--instructors who come to us trained in technology far ahead of what the university alone can provide.

Raymond Arcilla was employed to teach a hands-on hardware course in which students build their own PCs and learn basic theory about how components work. Extensive attempts to find qualified instructors with hands-on knowledge and at least a Master's degree were unsuccessful at the time the course had to be staffed. Mr. Arcilla has nine years experience at managerial levels in the appropriate part of the field, so he was a strong choice from the point of view of course content.

Harris Greenberg and Robert Newhoff were hired to do introductory programming courses. It has been our experience that practitioners in programming do much better than theoreticians with beginning programming courses. This has been reflected in superior student evaluations for both of these instructors. Mr. Newhoff has sixteen years professional experience as a programmer and programming manager. Mr. Greenberg has seventeen years professional experience as a programmer, systems analyst, and project manager in a cutting edge environment at Disney. Although Mr. Greenburg's tenure at Woodbury was positive, he will not be a part-time instructor after the current year.

Fashion Marketing. Emily Davis teaches lower-level, technically-oriented courses in Fashion Marketing. She not only brings many years of outstanding fashion industry experience to the classroom but brings contacts in the field that translate into internship and future employment opportunities for our students. Given that the Department of Marketing, under which Fashion Marketing is housed, has only one full-time faculty who also serves as the department chair, such business outreach possibilities acquired through part-time faculty become all the more crucial to the well-being of the program. To maintain both University and ACBSP standards, Ms. Davis enrolled in an MBA program and will earn her degree in December, 1998.
